

Eternal Rest Grant Unto Him, O Lord

We all awoke on Easter Monday to surprising news that Pope Francis had died at 7:35am Roman time. It was a little surprising because he had rebounded from his five-week hospital stay in February and March. On Easter Sunday he greeted the pilgrims in St. Peter's Square and met Vice President Vance. Yet, the Lord comes at an unknown hour.

Upon the death of the Pope, we Catholics can feel like orphans. Our Holy Father and faithful shepherd has passed and we find ourselves rudderless without a captain at the helm. These are uncomfortable and anxiety-ridden days, especially as the cardinals prepare to elect a new Pope.

There are so many biographies and articles that you could read about Pope Francis, analyzing his life and legacy. I can add my own thoughts.

One of the memorable moments of his Papacy, for me, was the benediction that he led during the Covid pandemic. As the world was going crazy, shutting everything down, Pope Francis brought the Blessed Sacrament to the open doors of St. Peter's Basilica. It was dark and rainy outside, without another soul in sight. Pope Francis took the Blessed Sacrament and blessed the world. It was beautiful and simple, profound and prayerful. It highlighted his confidence in God, his faith in the Eucharist, and his love for the people.

Also I admire that Pope Francis isn't being buried in St. Peter's Basilica, but in the Basilica of St. Mary Major, which is the major church dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary in Rome. Pope Francis visited this church over 100 times in his 13 years as the Pope. Before and after every international journey, he visited the church to ask for Mary's intercession and to thank her for the journey. Even after he left the hospital a couple months ago, he stopped by St. Mary Major to thank the Blessed Virgin for his recovery. He always had a devotion to the Blessed Virgin and he often spoke of her maternal care in his life.

The final lasting memory was the way that he reached out to the marginalized, especially in a personal way. He didn't just talk about things, but he acted. For example, on his final Holy Thursday, he visited inmates in a prison. When Jesus says, "I was imprisoned, and you visited me," Pope Francis took this literally and sought out those who were sick, hungry, and imprisoned.

Each and every one of you may have your own memories of Pope Francis. There may be particular things he said or actions that he did which sticks in your memory. Let us pray for Pope Francis, that God may gather him to the Father's house in heaven. I encourage everyone to offer an Our Father, Hail Mary, and Glory Be for Pope Francis, especially families and young children. The prayers of children are very powerful.


DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY
