## **Christmas Season**

Today, we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. Family life can seem so ordinary, whether we are changing diapers, running kids to extracurricular activities, budgeting for 2025, babysitting grandchildren, or taking our spouse to a doctor's appointment. Yet, Jesus Christ entered into a family. It is remarkable that the God of the Universe completed household chores. On this day, we recall and celebrate that God blesses the ordinary moments of family life. They aren't foreign to God, outside of our faith life. Rather, family life, in its ordinariness and messiness, can draw us into a relationship with God.

We often call the family, the "Domestic Church." Basically, the family is the miniature Church. Everything the Church wants to teach children is first learned and best-learned at home. In the family, we learn how to pray, forgive, be forgiven, serve the poor, and so many other Christian virtues. We are formed in the love of God and each other in our family. Whether we are newly married or celebrating our 50th anniversary, at home, we can imitate Christ.

The Christmas Season has an abundance of feast days. On New Year's Day, we celebrate the Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God, and it is a Holy Day of Obligation. In former years, this feast was called the Circumcision of the Lord because Jesus would have been circumcised eight days after his birth. You can probably understand why the name changed.

Nonetheless it is an important day. Celebrating Mary as the "Mother of God" can sound a little weird. Can a human being really be the mother of the eternal and invisible God? The Council of Ephesus in 431 answered with a resounding, "Yes!" Mary is the mother of the entire Jesus, not just His human nature. Therefore, Mary is the Mother of God.

Start your 2025 off right by going to Mass for the Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God. Ask God to bless your new year. There is no better way to start your new year than with Mass on a Marian Feast Day! We are spoiled to be Catholic!

Finally, my new year is beginning with an adventure. Normally, I visit my family in January to decompress after the Christmas excitement, but this year will be a little different. Back in October 2023, I asked my dad if he had anything on his bucket list. Was there anything he wanted to do before he died? He immediately responded that he wanted to see the northern lights. He didn't care to leave the country, so he wanted to go to Alaska.

Since both my brothers are raising families and my mom isn't much for cold weather, I knew that I would be the one to go with dad. We are leaving on January 2nd for Alaska and returning January 10th. Pray that we don't freeze to death and that we see the Aurora Borealis. We might even ride a dog sled. Even better, Fr. Jarred Kohn is coming too.

Fr. John LaRosa from Philadelphia will be covering for me next week. He will be speaking on behalf of Food for the Poor. Thank you for welcoming him to our parish.



## Precepts of the Catholic Church

See Catechism of the Catholic Church, paragraphs 2041–2043

## 1. You shall attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation and rest from servile labor.

Requires the faithful to participate in the Eucharistic celebration when the Christian community gathers together on the day commemorating the Resurrection of the Lord **2. You shall confess your sins at least once a year**.

Ensures preparation for the Eucharist by the reception of the Sacrament of Reconciliation, which continues Baptism's work of conversion and forgiveness

## 3. You shall humbly receive your Creator in Holy Communion at least once a year during the Easter season.

Guarantees as a minimum the reception of the Lord's Body and Blood in connection with the Paschal feasts, the origin and center of the Christian liturgy

# 4. You shall observe the prescribed days of fasting and abstinence established by the Church.

Ensures the times of ascesis and penance which prepare us for the liturgical feasts and help us acquire mastery over our instincts and freedom of heart

## 5. You shall provide for the needs of the Church.

The faithful are obliged to assist with the material needs of the Church, each according to his own ability
