Almost Advent

appy Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, the King of the Universe, also known as Christ the King. This feast was instituted by Pope Pius XI in 1925. It was a response to the First World War. Pope Pius XI noticed that although the violence had ended, there was no true peace in the world. He said, "Christ has dominion over all creatures, a dominion not seized by violence nor usurped, but his by essence and by nature." Jesus didn't obtain his kingship by violence, but by sacrifice.

May Jesus Christ reign as King in our parish, homes, and hearts!

The Feast of Christ the King means that Advent begins next week, which is hard to believe. The months just fly by. Advent is a wonderful time to prepare for the birth of the King. We can take time to intentionally open our hearts to God, so that Jesus may find room in our heart.

One of the ways that we can do this is through the Sacrament of Confession (or Reconciliation). This Sacrament is sort of like taking out the trash. The garbage of our lives is our sin. Like our garbage, we could hide our sins in the basement and just forget about it. We could bury deep in our souls and act like is doesn't exist. However, eventually our trash will begin to stink. It will decompose and smell rank. Even if we have garbage in our home, we can get used to the smell and learn to live with it. Similarly, with our souls, our sin can stink. Even though we ignore it, it begins to fill our souls with a smell. We can even become used to the stench and become accustomed to our sinfulness

What we need to do is take out the trash. We take the time go through all the trash bins and empty them out, placing them in a large trash bin. With Confession, we

make an examination of conscience, gathering up our spiritual garbage. This garbage gets placed at the end of the road for the garbage man to take it. It is a public thing; your neighbors see that you have garbage, although they (hopefully) don't look through the garbage. Comparing this to Confession, everyone has spiritual garbage. We need to wait in line with our brothers and sisters in Christ for Confession. They see that you have garbage, although they don't know what kind of garbage vou have.

Finally you need a garbage man to pick up the trash. The trash man rides around on a truck and places people's garbage into the truck, and you never see it again. The trash man sees so much trash, that he doesn't really investigate each trash can - he is used to getting rid of people's garbage. The priest in the confessional is like the trash man. He takes your spiritual garbage and places it in God's mercy and it is never seen from again. Also, the priest deals with so much garbage, that it really doesn't faze him. He simply wants to help you get rid of the trash.

Please let God get rid of the spiritual garbage of your life. Let Him empty out the sinful mess in your life.

We have a couple extra times for Confession during Advent. There will be two extra times for Confession each week: Mondays from 5pm-6pm at St. Joseph Church and Thursdays after 8:00am Mass at Immaculate Conception Church. Also there will be two Days of Grace, Confession and Adoration from 9am to 9pm: December 12 at St. Joseph and December 23 at Immaculate Conception.

Scammers

If you're ever questioning a message, please call the parish office before responding. If you've been scammed, ignore the message (or report it as a "phishing message") and say a prayer for the scammer.
