Trying Something New

N ext Wednesday marks the observance of Ash Wednesday, signifying the commencement of the Lenten season. For many, this period is anticipated as an opportunity for improvement in various areas of life, including deeper prayer, enhanced discipline, and increased generosity. Ash Wednesday serves as a vital juncture for our spiritual well-being, allowing us to reorient our lives towards Christ and embrace the discipleship path He has laid out for us.

After last year's Ash Wednesday, we received some feedback on our Ash Wednesday schedule that was constructive and worth considering. The two observations were that all our evening services were around the same time (three started at 7pm and one at 6:30pm). It was suggested that we space them out a little bit. The second observation was that St. Joseph and St. Lawrence always had evening Masses, while Immaculate Conception and St. John always had Liturgy of the Word services. It was asked if we could rotate the Masses over the years.

Both observations made sense, so our parish staff and pastoral council discussed possibilities for Ash Wednesday, including switching the Mass and Liturgy of the Word services each year (for the evening events). Also we noticed that some of the services haven't been as well attended as others. This year for Ash Wednesday, we'll have the following schedule:

One other new item is that we will be adding a bunch of new confession times beginning Monday, March 10th. There will be more information in next weekend's bulletin article. I wanted to get everyone excited. Happy Jubilee Year!

Finally, Archbishop-designate Robert Casey's installation as the Archbishop of Cincinnati will be Thursday, April 3rd. Please pray for him, Archbishop

Schnurr, and the entire Archdiocese of Cincinnati. To commemorate the event, I purchased a new Casey's General Store hat!



Fast & Abstinence Reminders

Ash Wednesday, March 5 and Good Friday, April 18 are days of abstinence from meat and also days of fast, that is, limited to a single full meal. The other Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence from meat. The law of abstinence binds all Catholics 14 years and older. The law of fasting binds all Catholics from their 18th birthday until their 59th birthday (canons 97, 1252). "Let the paschal fast be kept sacred. Let it be celebrated everywhere on Good Friday and, where possible, prolonged throughout Holy Saturday, so that the joys of the Sunday of the Resurrection may be attained with uplifted and clear mind." (Constitution on the Liturgy, No. 110)
