

On the Horizon & a Message from David

June will be an exciting month in the Church's Liturgical life. During each of the five Sundays of June, we'll celebrate an important aspect of our faith. Here is the rundown:

Sunday, June 1: **the Ascension of Our Lord**. Forty Days after His Resurrection, Jesus ascends into heaven and sits at the right hand of the Father.

Sunday, June 8: **Pentecost**. Fifty days after Easter, during the Jewish Feast of Pentecost, the Holy Spirit descends upon the Apostles and Mary in the Upper Room, empowering them to boldly witness to Jesus.

Sunday, June 15: **Trinity Sunday** (and Father's Day). On the Sunday after Pentecost, we commemorate the three persons in one God.

Sunday, June 22: **Corpus Christi Sunday**. This feast celebrates the gift of the Holy Eucharist and the Real Presence of Jesus in His Body and Blood.

Friday, June 27: **the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart**. We look to the heart of Jesus as the image of His love for each of us. Sunday, June 29: **the Solemnity of the Apostles, Peter and Paul**. The feast of the two great Apostles trumps our normal Sunday of Ordinary Time. We commemorate their faith and leadership.

Finally, I get to announce our new Pastoral Council members, who won last weekend's election. They are: Todd Dietz, Anthony Heuker, Jeff Greve, and Scott Elchert. Congratulations and thank you to everyone who ran for Pastoral Council this year.



Pope Leo XIV was born September 14, 1955, in Chicago, Illinois. He holds a bachelor's degree from the Augustinian-run Villanova University in Pennsylvania and joined the order in 1977, making his solemn vows in 1981.

He joined the Augustinian mission in Peru in 1985 and largely worked in the country until 1999 when he was elected head of the Augustinians' Chicagobased province. From 2001 to 2013, he served as prior general of the worldwide order. In 2015, Pope Francis named him bishop of Chiclayo, in northern Peru, and the pope asked him also to be apostolic administrator of Callao, Peru, from April 2020 to May 2021.

Pope Francis elevated him to Cardinal in the Consistory of September 30, 2023, when he was assigned Cardinal of St. Monica. On February 6, 2025, Pope Francis promoted him to the highest degree of Cardinals, granting him the title of the Suburbicarian Church of Albano.

On May 8, 2025, Cardinal Protodeacon Dominique Mamberti pronounced the formula, "Habemus Papam," proclaiming to the city of Rome and to the whole world the news of the election of Robert Francis Cardinal Prevost as Pope Leo XIV.

Continue to pray and support our ministry and our parish.
